Socio-Economic Development (SED)

Imisebeyelanga Services is in possession of a Black Beneficiary Certificate and may conduct Socio-Economic Development on behalf of companies by facilitating their donations. We are certified to be fully compliant in terms of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act 53 of 2003), the concomitant Codes of Good Practice as published in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007 and all relevant criteria therein for the recognition of Socio-Economic Development contributions.

A Companies' B-BBEE Verification Agency may rely on our Black Beneficiary Certificate that confirms that the funds flow through to more than 75% Black Beneficiaries, as stipulated in the Codes of Good Practice, to obtain full recognition of the value donated to us. Generic Enterprises must spend 1% of their NPAT on qualifying initiatives within the measured financial period to obtain the 5 points available under the Socio-Economic Development element within the Codes of Good Practice.

Qualifying Small Enterprises must spend 1% of their NPAT on qualifying initiatives within the measured financial period to obtain the 25 points available under the Socio-Economic Development within the Codes of Good Practice.
